## CREATIVE ORCHESTRAL PROGRAM FOR SKILLED YOUTH

- > <u>FAME's Institute</u> is an institution established by <u>FAME'S Project</u>, co-funded by the <u>European Union</u> and supported by <u>Creative</u> <u>Europe</u> as part of the *Pan-European Cultural Entities* Call.
- > Launched in 2021 by FAME'S Project, a world-leading orchestral music production company specializing in orchestral soundtrack recordings for the media industry, including films, TV shows, streaming platforms, commercials, video games, as well as classical and pop music. The company has produced over 4,000 projects in the past 15 years.
- > Eligibility for young skilled musicians: Strings, Winds, Brass, Piano and Percussions, from 18–30 years old, who are citizens or permanent residents of the 27 EU countries or non-EU countries participating in the Creative Europe Programme.
- > Fully funded scholarship, no participation fees for students (only transportation to FAME'S is at their own expense).

## **VENUE & ACCOMODATION**



Located in Skopje, the capital of the Republic of North Macedonia, the FAME'S <u>building</u>. brings together all activities in one central 2,000m² facility, professional studio (500m²), offices (100m²), conference room (100m²), practice room (200m²) accommodation fully equipped and restaurant.

Each year, the Institute organizes 10 Orchestral Courses, held in February, April, May, July, and September. Each course lasts approximately 5 to 7 days, and students are required to apply for a minimum of 2 weeks of participation. Every course brings together 27 to 30 selected musicians from across Europe, creating a dynamic and collaborative orchestral environment.

## **APPLICATION PROCESS**

#### **Application phases:**

- 1. Early Bird Applications => (October December)
- ✔ Apply early for any course in the following year (February, April, May, July, September)
- ✔ Priority processing and greater course availability
- 2. Open Call => (Opens ~2 months before each course)
- ✓ Apply specifically for the upcoming session
- ✓ Apply closer to the course date

#### **Required Application Materials:**

- ✓ Resume/CV
- ✓ Two video recordings, following the guidelines below

#### **Video Guidelines:**

- ✔ One movement or excerpt from a classical or romantic concerto
- ✓ One movement or excerpt from a suite or sonata (up to the early 20th century)
- ✓ And/or a solo piece from your repertoire

#### **Technical Requirements:**

- ✓ Videos may be pre-recorded, but must not be older than six months
- ✓ Each piece must be recorded in a single take, with no editing
- ✓ Accompaniment is not required
- ✔ Each movement or selection may be submitted as a separate video
- ✓ While professional studio recordings are not required, the sound must be clear and of high quality
